Team In Training (TNT)

Team In Training coaches persons to run or walk a marathon or 1/2 marathon, cycle a century bike ride, complete a triathlon or adventure hike. Participants train and raise money to fight blood cancers in honor of their team hero. Heroes become a part of the team by sharing their stories and strength with TNT participants. Patient Heroes are encouraged to attend team events such as kick-off, team hero socials and a team events. The caring that heroes receive from their team is also a great support to them.

Light the Night @ Walk

Light the Night participants raise funds and carry illuminated balloons to celebrate and commemorate lives touched by cancer. During this 2-3 mile leisurely walk, survivors light the way with white balloons, while friends and supporters carry red balloons. Heroes are spotlighted on specific walk sites where they use their story to engage corporations, families, friends, and neighbors to be a part of this magical evening.

School and Youth

School and Youth offers students the opportunity to support those who are affected by blood cancers. By collecting spare change, schools compete to earn prizes like electronics, supplies, and pizza or pasta parties. Heroes are matched with participating schools and students to provide a face and story to the cause. Correspondence between schools and honorees can help raise awareness and funds.

Man & Woman of the Year

The Man and Woman of the Year competition is a chance for candidates to send fundraising letters, host creative parties, and solicit corporate support to generate donations for the Society. From our honorees, a Boy and Girl of the Year are selected to be a part of the activities and share their inspirational stories.
